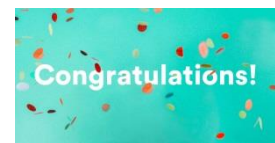

You Can Make the World a Better Place

Each of us has the ability to make a difference in the world. In fact, for Catholics, acting for the common good is a requirement. "It is the duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)*, #2239).

Be informed, be decisive, and be heard. Pope Francis said, "...good Catholics immerse themselves in politics by offering the best of themselves so that the leader can govern." Government is meant to be a partnership between citizens and those they elect. Look past the newsy gossip about candidates and do your research of upcoming local, state, and national elections so you can make excellent, informed decisions in the voting booth. **Be the best at what you do.** No matter what you do for a living, whether you feel your efforts make a difference or go unnoticed, always do your best. "Whatever your task, work heartily, as serving the Lord and not men" (Colossians 3:23). Our actions cannot be defined by others, but by what God asks of us and what we owe to ourselves. **Be active.** When Jesus was among us, he comforted those who were sad, fed people who were hungry, gathered close friends, shared love, alleviated suffering. Do the same.

Tell Me a Story

Not everyone has a good faith story of his or her own. Some people haven't personally experienced the love of God or the warmth of a parish. Perhaps someone in your life doesn't know how to turn to God in prayer or how to lean on him for strength or consolation. Telling a friend, neighbor, or coworker your own story could provide the spark she needs to begin a story of her own. Where do you start?

A similar situation – When someone confides in you a struggle he is experiencing, consider drawing an analogy to a similar experience in your own life. Include how you felt and how God supported you.

Peace obtained through prayer – Not everyone knows how to pray when troubled. Talk about a time you experienced worry or anxiety, describe how you prayed and detail how God brought you peace through prayer.

Scripture inspiration – Perhaps there was a time when hearing or reading a Gospel or a homily spoke to your situation and gave you hope or direction. Help your listener turn to Scripture for inspiration.

We can't all be preachers, but we can all be **storytellers**. We each have a love story of how God has reached out to us. Sharing something so personal can help others see that God can work in their lives, too.

Baptismal Bargain

When we are baptized, God forms an unbreakable covenant with us promising His unconditional love. "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). Our part of the bargain is to obey him and love him, and put him first in our lives. At Baptism, we are marked as God's for life. That can never change.

The fee for the program is \$50.00 for one child & \$90.00 for two or more children.

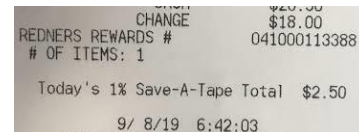
Registration fee is due when you register. If you **need financial aid** speak with Sister Mary.

Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family’s expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

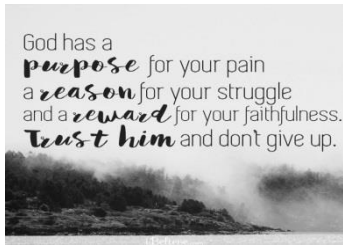

Show Others the Way to God

Build bridges. Spend time with those seeking God. Show them what a life with God looks like. Invite seekers to dinner, go for coffee, listen to their problems. In other words, be a friend. **Share his love.** God's love breaks down barriers and removes prejudices. Act with love toward others. A little kindness may open the door for the Gospel.

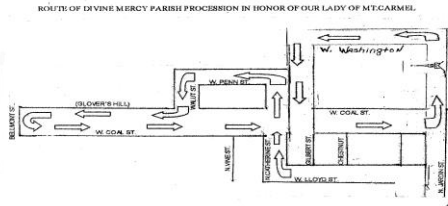
July 14 – St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1680).
