**Natural Family Planning**

*As a Parish, we join with the Diocese of Allentown and Diocese’ nationwide in the celebration of Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week (July 23-29). These dates highlight the anniversary of the paper encyclical Humanae Vitae (July 25), articulating Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, marriage, conjugal love, and responsible parenthood. The National theme this year is, Marriage: One Flesh, Given and Received, NFP – Supporting God’s gifts of love and life in marriage. God designed marriage as an “Intimate partnership of life and love” (see Gaudium et spes no. 48). In God’s design, marriage is a unique union of one man with one woman “for the whole of life”(see Canon 1055, The Code of Canon Law). Marriage is oriented to the good of the spouses and to the creation and nurture of new human life (see Gaudium et spes, no. 48). Therefore, making decisions about when and how many children to have in marriage is a sacred responsibility that God has entrusted to husband and wife. This is the foundation of what the Church calls, “Responsible Parenthood,” the call to discern God’s will for your marriage while respecting His design for live and love.*

*Natural Family Planning is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid conception. These methods are based on the observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman’s menstrual cycle. NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting God’s plan for marriage and the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP serves to enrich the bond between husband and wife. *The Catholic Church celebrates human sexuality and science as a gift from God. Natural Family Planning (NFP) is a term used to described a variety of different scientific, natural, and moral methods of fertility awareness. Married couples are called to make responsible decisions about parenthood while remaining open to life & God’s plan.*

*Together, married couples choose a method of fertility awareness that works best for them. They learn to observe and chart the signs and symptoms of their combined fertility. They then use this information to continuously evaluate and discern God’s plan for their marriage and family.*

*The Fertility Awareness Methods used for NFP are true forms of family planning because they are extremely accurate in both assisting couples to achieve or avoid pregnancy. These methods are nearly three times more effective than other means in helping couples successfully achieve a pregnancy. All methods of NFP are between 98-99 % effective in assisting couples in avoiding pregnancy if needed.*

*Unlike contraception, NFP respects and protects both the love-giving (unitive) and life-giving (Procreative) nature of the conjugal act. Couples can honor their wedding vows and express their free, total, faithful, and fruitful love for one another in and through every conjugal act. These methods naturally allow for married couples to regularly and prayerfully discern whether God is calling them to have more children. In this way, married couples consciously and intentionally invite God and His blessings into their marriage and family. NFP also fosters the virtues needed for a strong, healthy marriage relationship, such as trust in God and one another, increased communication and self- control. While the nationwide divorce rate is nearly 50%, those who use NFP have a less than 14% divorce rate. (<https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/33487745/>). The gift of Natural Family Planning supports God’s design for married Love.*

**Tell Me a Story**

Not everyone has a good faith story of his or her own. Some people haven't personally experienced the love of God or the warmth of a parish. Perhaps someone in your life doesn't know how to turn to God in prayer or how to lean on him for strength or consolation. Telling a friend, neighbor, or coworker your own story could provide the spark she needs to begin a story of her own. Where do you start?

**A similar situation** – When someone confides in you a struggle he is experiencing, consider drawing an analogy to a similar experience in your own life. Include how you felt and how God supported you.

**Peace obtained through prayer** – Not everyone knows how to pray when troubled. Talk about a time you experienced worry or anxiety, describe how you prayed and detail how God brought you peace through prayer.

**Scripture inspiration** – Perhaps there was a time when hearing or reading a Gospel or a homily spoke to your situation and gave you hope or direction. Help your listener turn to Scripture for inspiration.

We can't all be preachers, but we can all be **storytellers**. We each have a love story of how God has reached out to us. Sharing something so personal can help others see that God can work in their lives, too.

**The Best Way to Pray**

Sometimes we pray to get what we want or need. Sometimes we pray for guidance. But the best reason to pray – and the reason Jesus prayed – is to join ourselves to God. But there is no one way to do that.

When his disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray, he taught them the "Our Father." It is a prayer of praise and gives God the glory that he is due. It is also a petition in which we ask God to provide what we need. Third, it asks for forgiveness and the strength to be forgiving. And last, it is an acknowledgement that God knows what is best for us and reminds us to submit to his will rather than our own.

God hears all prayers, but he wants to know that we are committed to that for which we are asking. Jesus said to be persistent and continue to ask for God's help, seek God's will, and open the door to God's grace in our lives.
