Special Voluntary Collection for the Fire Victims, Maui, Hawaii Collection Totally Voluntary

We have all been made aware of the deadly wildfire that swept the town of Lahaina, Maui, Hawaii. Sadly, the death toll stands at over 100 persons, with other persons still missing. Adding to the tragedy is the almost complete destruction of the town. But God works in mysterious ways even in these tragic events. The parish church of Maria Lanakila, an historic Catholic Church, was left unscathed amidst the destruction of the rest of the town. Maria Lankila is translated as Our Lady of Victory. The pastor, Father Kuriakose Nadooparambil, who was permitted to enter the fire area to visit the church, reported that not even the flowers in the church were wilted or singed. There was only a covering of ash on the pews. The parish rectory was also spared but the parish school, convent and hall were destroyed. Despite this "miracle," the parish and town face the immediate need to provide food and shelter for thousands left homeless and the future challenge to rebuild.

Giving From a Grateful Heart

In Old Testament times, a faithful farmer gave the first of his harvest to the temple for God's use. He understood that it was through God's blessing that he had a harvest at all. We, too, can give to God from our grateful hearts.

Give God the first, best moments. Many of us rush through our day from the moment we open our eyes. We forget that it is by God's grace that we are even able to see a new day. Instead, give the first moments of the day to God in prayer.

Pay God first. Most of us pay pressing bills first – housing, food, insurance – and give to the Church from what is left. Then we grumble when our parish fundraises to meet its needs. Yet all we have is through God's blessing in the first place. In fact, if we each give to the Sunday collection for God's use a first portion of our income – the Biblical 10%, for example – all our important needs will be met.

We Can Make a More Peaceful World

Ordinarily we think of violence as physical – a blow, a gunshot, a bombing. It seems that we hear and read about acts of war every day. But wars escalate from everyday acts in homes, neighborhoods, and communities that can be as subtle as words or gestures that dampen the spirit of another person. As Christians, we can prevent violence by living our faith. **Embrace diversity** – don't just tolerate it. Different as we are, we are all made in God's image and likeness. There is great diversity in the communion of saints. **Develop more empathy** – see situations from another's perspective. It's the best way to understand the impact of our actions on those affected by them. **Treat everyone with dignity** – don't ignore others as a way of expressing anger or disapproval. Giving the silent treatment instead of working out problems denies much needed human contact and fails to solve conflict. **Choose entertainment carefully** – a steady diet of violent entertainment and media

Choose entertainment carefully – a steady diet of violent entertainment and media helps us become comfortable with violence and to see people as characters rather than humans. Instead, pray for victims of violence and for the souls of those who perpetrate it.**Detach** – value people more than things. Share what you have. Don't take more than you need. Don't get so attached to achieving an outcome that you forget love matters more.



Be Not Afraid

The phrase "be not afraid," made famous by Pope St. John Paul II, helps us to remember that no matter what happens in the world, God is in control and we are in good hands. The Holy Father asked us to put our trust in Jesus who redeemed the world. **Refuse to worry.** Jesus reminded us that tomorrow isn't guaranteed to anyone (Luke 12:20). What brings us peace is to tend to today's challenges and let God take care of tomorrow. Nothing happens without His consent and he won't permit anything that is bad for us. When we place ourselves in His care, we have nothing to fear. **Keep your eyes on Him.** Don't let the world blind you to God's presence in your life. We may not feel powerful at times, but when we stay close Jesus through His Church, we receive the grace we need to keep fighting temptations to sin. God has overcome the world. With His help, we will win the daily battle for Heaven.

Why do Some Churches Have Altar Rails?

Altar rails, or "Communion rails," located between the sanctuary and the front pews, helped facilitate the Communion distribution when everyone received Communion on the tongue while kneeling. The rails encouraged the faithful to be reverent before the Face of God – literally. Called, "the people's altar," the rails were also where communicants offered their spiritual sacrifices to God directly as they received Him. We can do this without rails, but kneeling for Communion is a powerful reminder of Who we are receiving.
