What Did Jesus Mean By “Turn the Other Cheek”?

To understand Jesus’ instruction of *“turning the other cheek”* (Matthew 5:39), it’s necessary to understand some cultural context. Someone striking you on the right cheek would’ve used his left hand, which was considered unclean in Jesus’ day. Striking with the left was for slaves, children, and anyone else you considered your social inferior. Turning the other cheek told the aggressor, “I am your equal. You will not treat me that way again.” To “turn the other cheek” is often misinterpreted as an order to do nothing to stop evil. What it really means is, *do no evil* to stop evil. Instead, we can graciously respond to cruel remarks (if they deserves a response at all), get outside help, work for changes in policies, show kindness to our oppressors. Most of all, pray for the aggressor’s change of heart. You don’t always know the fruits of your prayers until later on. Resisting the temptation to “get even” is possible with the grace of God, who forgave his persecutors from the Cross.

A Little Reminder For Cemetery Lot Owners in order to keep bringing all our Parish Cemeteries in line with the guidelines and regulations of the Diocese the following will still be enforced: all bricks, fine & crushed stone, plants, fresh & plastic flowers not in containers, fences, borders of all types will be removed & discarded immediately due to the fact that they cause a problem for maintenance of your lot. Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family’s expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

We are asking that all Christmas flowers be removed from cemetery lots.

Tell Me a Story

Not everyone has a good faith story of his or her own. Some people haven’t personally experienced the love of God or the warmth of a parish. Perhaps someone in your life doesn’t know how to turn to God in prayer or how to lean on him for strength or consolation. Telling a friend, neighbor, or coworker your own story could provide the spark she needs to begin a story of her own. Where do you start?

A similar situation – When someone confides in you a struggle he is experiencing, consider drawing an analogy to a similar experience in your own life. Include how you felt and how God supported you.

Peace obtained through prayer – Not everyone knows how to pray when troubled. Talk about a time you experienced worry or anxiety, describe how you prayed and detail how God brought you peace through prayer.

Scripture inspiration – Perhaps there was a time when hearing or reading a Gospel or a homily spoke to your situation and gave you hope or direction. Help your listener turn to Scripture for inspiration.

We can’t all be preachers, but we can all be **storytellers**. We each have a love story of how God has reached out to us. Sharing something so personal can help others see that God can work in their lives, too.

Advice, Comfort, and Encouragement in the Bible

The Bible is full of practical life guidance that is as relevant today as it was when written. Its advice, comfort, and encouragement is timeless.

Advice

Written by a wise Old Testament scribe and teacher, **Book of Sirach** offers advice on just about everything we deal with today—friendship, education, finances, etiquette, marriage, family life, and more.

Comfort

In **St. Matthew’s Gospel**, Jesus gives comfort for the insecurities of daily life. For example, *“Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?”* (Matthew 6:26). For more, see Matthew 6:25-34, 7:7-11, 11:28, and 28:20.

Encouragement

Need encouragement? Try Psalm 118, *“The Lord is with me, I will not be afraid.”* Or, Psalm 40, *“I waited patiently for the Lord’s help; then he listened to me and heard my cry.”* And Psalm 23, *“I fear no harm for you are at my side; your rod and staff give me courage.”*

Roomful of Friends Learning about the saints is a like walking into a room full of strangers. You scan the faces looking for a friendly one who beckons you over.
