Why do We Canonize Saints?

Canonization is the declaration by the pope that a person is worthy of veneration as a saint because he or she lived a life of heroic virtue or remained faithful to God through martyrdom and is now in Heaven with God.

The process of canonization is lengthy. After a person dies, supporters can introduce a cause for sainthood on his or her behalf. A thorough investigation of the candidate is performed which includes examining all writings and hearing the testimony of witnesses who knew the individual. If it's decided that he or she did live a life of heroic virtue, the person is declared Venerable.

Before the candidate can achieve the next step, Beatification, a miracle has must be attributed to the person's intercession with God. The miracle must be a suspension of the natural law, such as a healing that can't be explained. The candidate is then known as Blessed.

The final step is canonization, which requires a second confirmed miracle. The person is then known as Saint.

Q&A: How Could God Send His Only Son to Die?

Because Adam and Eve sinned, we needed a Savior to pay the price and save us from sin and death. *“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life”* (John 3:16). While it was not easy for God to send his Son to die, he did it because he loves us and wants us to be with him in Heaven.

However, this does not mean God the Son was forced to die for us. Jesus said, *“No one takes [my life] from me, but I lay it down on my own”* (John 10:18). Jesus’ sacrifice was freely offered to the Father on our behalf. *“Indeed, out of love for his Father and for men, whom the Father wants to save, Jesus freely accepted his Passion and death”* (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 609). The love of the Father and the Son for us was proved to the end on the Cross.

Why do Catholics Need Priests?

Priests serve a special function in the Church. Non-ordained people – called lay people or laity – take Christ into the world. We bring him into the workplace, our schools, the neighborhood. That comes from “the common priesthood” of all the faithful through Baptism and Confirmation.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders consecrates the clergy “to feed the Church by the word and grace of God.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1535) Specifically, the clergy administer the sacraments, something lay people can’t do.

Why do Catholics Need Faith?

“Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen” (Hebrews 11:1). Christians know that Jesus is our Savior and our lives are in his hands. We also know that by virtue of his suffering, death, and Resurrection, we have hope of sharing in his glory in Heaven. He said so. It is through faith that all the other virtues flow. Through faith we believe, *“For with God, nothing will be impossible”* (Luke 1:37).

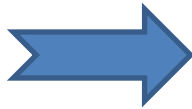

Mark 1:12-15, The Path to Easter

This Gospel describes Jesus’ actions after his baptism by John. He prepared for his public ministry by going into the desert for forty days. There he was tempted by Satan, was among wild beasts, and was ministered to by angels.

The lessons of this Gospel can help us prepare not only for Easter, but for the rest of our lives. Temptations surround us. Satan is constantly trying to tear us away from God. The wild beasts represent every kind of danger and evil. But the angels provide God’s protection for us. We can rely on them to help us if we ask for God’s help.

We can use Lent to fulfill Jesus’ proclamation, “Repent, and believe in the gospel.” The best way to resist evil is to stay in a state of grace. Go to Confession frequently, receive the Eucharist every week – daily, if possible, and pray as often during the day as you can. When you spend as much of your day with God as possible, Satan and his temptations won’t be able to get through your defenses.

A Little Reminder For Cemetery Lot Owners in order to keep bringing all our Parish Cemeteries in line with the guidelines and regulations of the Diocese the following will still be enforced: all bricks, fine & crushed stone, plants, fresh & plastic flowers not in containers, fences, borders of all types will be removed & discarded immediately due to the fact that they cause a problem for maintenance of your lot. Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family's expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

We are asking that all Christmas flowers be removed from cemetery lots.

Meet God At “Little Easter”

One amazing fact of which Easter reminds us is that God lives and lives with us. Yet, as the joy of the celebration fades, we may feel distant from our loving, living God. In fact, we can renew our Easter joy every week at Mass on Sunday, our “little Easter.” It’s a great place to find God. **The Priest.** During Mass, the priest is not acting on his own but in the person of Christ (“In Persona Christi”). Bishops and priests act in persona Christi when they offer Mass, forgive sins, preach on behalf of the Church, and perform other acts of shepherding and teaching. So, we find God in the priest. **The Word.** Much of what goes on at Mass is directly from Scripture – the prayers we say together, the hymns we sing, the readings, etc. Since Scripture is the inspired word of God, we can find God in his Word.

The Eucharist. What starts as bread and wine becomes the body and blood of Christ. So we meet God in the consecrated Eucharist. **The People.** When we unite to praise God, we are his Church. “For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them” (Matthew 18:20). So God is there when we worship with others at Mass.
