Each parishioner will be allowed **one weekday Mass and one weekend Mass.** Please note: **For every Mass for 2025 we will be asking for a contact name, address and phone number.** Thank you for your cooperation in this matter! Remember, the Mass Book fills up quickly! Candles will also be taken for 2025 at this time. If you would like to have a candle lit on a special day in any of the parishes, it is important that you notify us as soon as possible. The dates fill quickly.

Important Notice

The annual Priests' Convocation will be held this year from Tuesday, October 22nd, Wednesday, October 23rd, Thursday, October 24th and Friday, October 25th. Instead of two sessions as in the past, there will be only one general session this year. As a result, all priests will be attending the Convocation at this time. However, there will be NO Mass from Wednesday, October 23rd through Friday, October 25th. And there will be NO funerals scheduled from October 23rd through October 25th. All Funeral Masses will be scheduled beginning on Monday, October 28th. They will be scheduled as they come in. Burials will be able to take place as long as no priest is needed for prayers at the cemetery.

Anointing of the sick will be done if a priest can be found to do it. Both nursing homes have been notified.

**Special Collection for the Relief of those affected by Hurricane Helene & Hurricane Milton
October 26th and 27th**

Hurricane Helene has struck hard and caused much damage across the Southeastern Region of the United States of America. In addition to over 200 lives lost, the storms have left large areas in utter destruction which will take months, if not years, to rebuild. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has requested that each Bishop take up a collection within his Diocese to aid in the recovery efforts. The funds raised for this purpose will be administered through the Bishops’ Emergency Disaster Fund, which will work with Catholic Charities USA for the distribution of the monies. Bishop Schlert has authorized this collection to be taken up in the parishes in the Diocese of Allentown . This will be a cash collection; no special envelope will be provided.

Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family's expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

St. Teresa of Avila
 Born in 1515, St. Teresa joined the Carmelites—over family objections—in 1535. Soon after, she became so ill that the sisters dug a grave for her. St. Teresa recovered and wrote a book on prayer called *The Interior Castle*, based on her suffering. In 1562, she founded a stricter order whose nuns wore rough brown habits and sandals instead of shoes. Despite initial resistance, she founded several convents of Discalced Carmelites and helped reform the Carmelite friars.

Why do Catholics Have Two Versions of the Creed?

Both creeds summarize what Catholics believe but were written at different times for different purposes. The Apostles' Creed is the summary of the beliefs of the early Church. The Nicene Creed is the expanded form of the Apostles' Creed, stemming from two Church councils (Nicaea, AD 325; Constantinople, AD 381) to combat Arianism, which proposed Jesus was not God but a kind of super-saint. The Nicene Creed emphasizes Jesus' divinity, His divine Sonship, and the divinity of the Holy Spirit.

How Can I “Love” People I Don’t Like?

In fact, Jesus addressed this very question in Matthew 22. The Jewish leaders didn't like Jesus. Jesus made them angry when he accused them of hypocrisy and insincerity. They knew he was right, of course. So some of the Pharisees tried to trick Jesus into saying something illegal in public. They asked Jesus which of the Jewish laws was most important. If he encouraged people to disregard any law, he could be harshly punished. This was an old debate, so the lawyer who challenged Jesus only asked hoping that Jesus would trip himself up. Instead Jesus said everything starts and ends with love – love for God and each other. To love God is to love one another. They are as inseparable as the beams of the cross. True love of neighbor is measured by how we treat those outside our circle. It means including people we may prefer to exclude or avoid. Jesus loved prostitutes, thieves, lepers, even Pharisees. This is how God loves and we are to do no less.
