“Live in Harmony With One Another”

In times of uncertainty or stress, tempers can shorten, perspectives narrow, and peace suffers. It is important to remember that Jesus came to bring love and unity. His followers are asked to do the same. *“The rich and the poor meet together; the Lord is the maker of them all”* (Proverbs 22:2) – embrace diversity, don’t just tolerate it. Different as we are, we are all made in God’s image and likeness. There is great diversity in the communion of saints. *“Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another”* (1 John 4:11) – as children of God, all humans were created with inherent dignity that we are required to acknowledge. Trying to understand others’ perspectives is the best way to realize the impact of our actions on them. *“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God”* (Matthew 5:9) – a steady diet of violent entertainment and media helps us become comfortable with violence and to see people as characters rather than humans. Instead, live with peace and pray for victims of violence. *“And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts”* (Colossians 3:15). This means we have to make the choice to trust God’s promises (letting His peace rule) or to rely on ourselves and reject the peace He offers.

Monday, December 9, 2024: The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Holy Day of Obligation)

In a memo to the U.S. Bishops, the Vatican confirmed that the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception usually celebrated on the 8th day of December must be transferred and observed as a Holy Day of Obligation on the 9th day of December since the 8th day of December in 2024 is the 2nd Sunday of Advent. In light of this new directive, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Monday, December 9, 2024 is to be observed as a Holy Day of Obligation. The Mass Schedule will be as follows:

If we let him, God will work in our lives. Because he’s perfect, God can’t make mistakes. When we trust him completely, we feel a sense of personal well-being, security, and peace. Forgiveness is a gift for you. Right or wrong, when we hold onto an injury, we get trapped in the pain of it indefinitely. Forgiving frees us to move on. Forgiveness is something we do for ourselves: **Start with a sign.** Even if you are the one injured, let the other person know you are ready to forgive by offering something tangible: flowers, a card, a hug. *“Come now, let us set things right, says the Lord”* (Isaiah 1:18). **Separate the offense from the offender.** God doesn’t abandon us when we sin. He loves us no matter what and asks that we do the same for each other. **Forgive and forget.** You can’t have one without the other. Forgiveness entails cancelling a debt, whether by God or another person. *“(Love) does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things ...”* (1 Corinthians 13:5-8). **Celebrate.** A mended relationship is stronger than one that has never been tested.

A Little Reminder For Cemetery Lot Owners

in order to keep bringing all our Parish Cemeteries in line with the guidelines and regulations of the Diocese the following will still be enforced: all bricks, fine & crushed stone, plants, fresh & plastic flowers not in containers, fences, borders of all types will be removed & discarded immediately due to the fact that they cause a problem for maintenance of your lot. Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family’s expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

Payments for Parish Funerals

Funeral fees must be paid 24 hours prior to the burial. We ask that the family of the deceased come to the parish office and pay directly to the church. Please make no payment to the funeral directors. If payment is not received within 24 hours of burial, there cannot be any burial in the parish cemetery. Also, all Lot Care (Perpetual Care/Cemetery Care) must be current including current burial.
