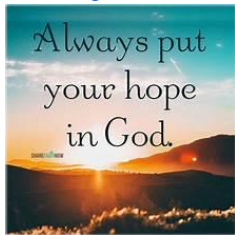

Forgiveness is a Gift for You

Right or wrong, when we hold onto an injury, we get trapped in the pain of it indefinitely. Forgiving frees us to move on. Forgiveness is something we do for ourselves: **Start with a sign.** Even if you are the one injured, let the other person know you are ready to forgive by offering something tangible: flowers, a card, a hug. *“Come now, let us set things right, says the Lord”* (Isaiah 1:18). **Separate the offense from the offender.** God doesn’t abandon us when we sin. He loves us no matter what and asks that we do the same for each other. **Forgive and forget.** You can’t have one without the other. Forgiveness entails cancelling a debt, whether by God or another person. *“(Love) does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things ...”* (1 Corinthians 13:5-8).

Trusting God in Unexpected Moments

Imagine you’re at a wedding celebration for your friends. The atmosphere is lively, the music is playing, and everyone is enjoying themselves—until you overhear a troubling conversation. The kitchen has run out of wine. Due to an oversight, the caterers didn’t bring enough, and with all the stores closed, the situation seems hopeless. What now?
“They have no wine” (John 2:3). Moments of crisis can catch us off guard, but they don’t have to shake us. When Mary encountered this dilemma at the wedding in Cana, she didn’t panic or place blame. Instead, she turned to the one she knew could help—her Son, Jesus. With confidence, she simply informed Him of the need, trusting fully in His ability to provide.
“Do whatever He tells you” (John 2:5). These profound words, Mary’s last recorded in Scripture, offer us a powerful lesson. When we bring our problems to God, He often invites us to be part of the solution. Trusting Him means being open to His direction, even when it leads to unexpected actions. The servants at Cana likely didn’t anticipate filling massive jars with water, yet their obedience led to an extraordinary outcome—the finest wine, far surpassing anything they could have imagined. With God, the impossible becomes possible.

What do Icons Offer for Our Devotional Life?

Icons are a revered form of sacred art. These sacred images carry a deep historical and theological significance, rich in symbolism and spiritual depth. Recognizable by their distinctive “flattened” style, vivid colors, and frequent use of gold backgrounds, icons often depict significant events from the lives of Jesus, Mary, and the saints, offering a window into their mystical and spiritual dimensions.
 At first glance, the stylized, two-dimensional nature of icons, coupled with the direct gaze of the figures, can feel unfamiliar or even challenging to engage with in prayer. It is often recommended to begin by spending just five minutes a day in quiet reflection before an icon, gradually increasing the duration over time. There is no need to rush—prayer with icons is a contemplative journey, and as we remain open and attentive, the Holy Spirit gradually unveils their deeper meaning to us.

A Little Reminder For Cemetery Lot Owners in order to keep bringing all our Parish Cemeteries in line with the guidelines and regulations of the Diocese the following will still be enforced: all bricks, fine & crushed stone, plants, fresh & plastic flowers not in containers, fences, borders of all types will be removed & discarded immediately due to the fact that they cause a problem for maintenance of your lot. Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family’s expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.
All Summer flowers must be removed!

Payments for Parish Funerals
 Funeral fees must be paid 24 hours prior to the burial. We ask that the family of the deceased come to the parish office and pay directly to the church. Please make no payment to the funeral directors. If payment is not received within 24 hours of burial, there cannot be any burial in the parish cemetery. Also, all Lot Care (Perpetual Care/Cemetery Care) must be current including current burial.

Simple Ways to Live a Better Life

The weeks before Lent are a good time to decide how to live a holier, happier life. Trying just one of these ideas can make a big difference in the way you live: **Live in the moment.** We can’t change the past and don’t know the future. The choices we make right now are all that count. **Be the real you.** Don’t compare yourself with others or try to imitate people who are smarter, richer, or cooler. God loves each of us for who we are, not who we are like. **Avoid drama.** If you find yourself seeking attention and sympathy from other people – or get drawn in by others who do – try substituting activities or people you find positive and interesting instead. **Face your fears.** List your worst fears, the ones you are afraid to tell anyone. Are they realistic? If so, take action to resolve them. Otherwise, cross each off your list and let it go. **Talk less.** Weigh your words before you say them. Spend more time listening. **Spend time with happy people.** Surround yourself with people who are positive and want to improve their lives. Let go of those who drain your energy. **Work happy.** No matter how you earn a paycheck, give it your very best effort. That turns a job into a prayer.

Feast Days

February 10 – St. Scholastica (543). Twin sister to St. Benedict, St. Scholastica established a community of religious women about five miles from her brother’s monastery.

February 17 – The Seven Holy Founders (13th century). Seven Italian noblemen who withdrew from the immorality of the times to live in prayer, simplicity and penance. Their order, the Servants of Mary, was later approved by the Holy See in 1304.

How Will You Fill Your God-Shaped Hole?

St. Augustine wrote, “You have made us for yourself and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in Thee,” (Confessions, Saint Augustine). Humans are created with a longing for something infinitely good, true, and beautiful - God. If we try to fill that longing with things that are not God, we are unsatisfied.

Make room. We pursue money, friends, power, or possessions, thinking that we will be happy if we accumulate enough. The problem is that earthly rewards don't last and distract us from what does. King Solomon could have chosen all the riches, esteem, and power in the world but rejected all because they would distract him from God.

Value what lasts. “For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God” (Romans 8:7). Pleasure makes us feel good in the moment but fades so we need more to feel good. Worse, pursuit of pleasure can lead to sin. Pleasure is not happiness. Happiness results when God shares himself with us and we draw close to him.

Grow in love. Having received the gift of divine life, we must give it to others. “Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another” (1 John 4:11). When we share God's life and love, we grow in that very life and love.

God's promises assure us of His perfect plan: “For I know well the plans I have in mind for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare, not for woe, plans to give you a future full of hope” (Jeremiah 29:11). If trusting Him feels difficult, invite Him into your doubts and fears. Ask Him to reveal His goodness and faithfulness—He will answer, because He is always near. Refocus your heart and trust God's plan for your life. Let go of distractions, realign your priorities, and step into the peace that comes from seeking Him first.
